2023 CONFIRMATION PACKET

What is Confirmation?

Confirmation is one of the three sacraments of initiation for Catholics. It is a sacrament that will deepen the baptismal gifts and equip students to have a stronger Catholic Faith. Confirmation is administered by laying on of hands and anointing with chrism accompanied by prayer. The effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is for the individual to be sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Our Confirmation program begins in the spring semester of the 10th grade year; students are confirmed in the fall semester of their 11th grade year.

CATECHESIS

The students will have six options to choose from for outside individual formation between March 1st and August 1st. Holy Spirit's in person required Confirmation Classes take place during the Fall Semester of Junior Year beginning August 13th. Students are expected to attend all classes since there are only 7. SACRAMENT

A required practice and parent/sponsor meeting will be held the day before the Confirmation.

JUNIOR CONFIRMATION RETREAT

<u>Purpose</u>: gives students a final opportunity to reflect as a community about receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation and to grow closer to God through fellowship and community.

Individual Formation Requirement :

Six Resources to choose from:

+ If your student *does not attend Catholic School*, he or she must pick 3 resources.

+ If your student *does attend Catholic School*, he or she must pick 2 resources.

• Read Decision Point by Matthew Kelly

- This is an incredible resource that I will have available for your student for free (as supplies provide) at the Parish. This book is an incredible journey through Catholicism by Matthew Kelley that can be read individually or as a family. Once your student has completed the book, I will send a writing prompt that will ask for a brief written reflection to prove completion. The book must be finished by August 1st.

• Formed video program

- Holy Spirit Parish offers a subscription to Formed which is a Catholic learning service on demand, it can be reached online through the website or through the Formed App. I will have a set list of videos and questions that your student will complete and email back to me as proof of completion. The videos cover key points of Catholic Formation. The program must be completed by August 1st. Email for Videos / Questions.

• Attend the Sunday School on Church History 9:15-10:45

- If your student would like to participate in the Sunday School class, this upcoming year's class will focus on Church history and is from 9:15-10:45 on Sundays. You can sign up via Charity Firestone who's email I can give you. Send me proof of signing up when you do so. The next class begins in August of 2023. I will have a separate sign in sheet for Confirmation Students to check attendance. If your student is currently in the class, I encourage him / her to sign up for next year's as well.

• Attend Youth Group weekly

- If your student does not currently attend youth group it is a weekly event that typically includes a dinner, talk or reflection, and fun activity. This is a great way to surround yourself with peers who are also interested in the Faith and growing together through healthy fellowship. The event is weekly on Wednesday's from 7:00-8:30. I will have a separate sign in sheet for Confirmation Students to check attendance. Students that choose this option will be expected at weekly events but will be allowed 1 excused absence per month.

• Volunteer to participate in the Live Stations

- The Live stations are a beautiful volunteer opportunity during this Lent. Our high school and Middle school students will walk us through the 14 stations of the cross on March 24th at 6:00pm. There are acting, behind the scenes, and reading parts available. If you are interested in signing up, please contact me or Zavie George. Rehearsals will be from 4:30-5:30 March

3, 10, 17, with the performance day on the 24th. You must attend at least 2 of these rehearsals to participate.

• Complete 25 Service Hours

- Service is incredibly transforming, beneficial, and eyeopening. I ask that if you choose this option, you email <u>youthgroupmgm@gmail.com</u> the place(s) you would like to complete your hours. After I approve of the project or site, you may begin. I will give you a log to keep track of your hours. Once your hours are completed, I ask that you write a one page reflection on the experience, how it has prepared you for Confirmation, and what values you gained from participating. This opportunity is a good option for those of you with jobs or sports who cannot make weekly commitments during school. These hours must be completed, submitted by turning in the log & reflection via email or in person at Holy Spirit by August 1st.

Your student must submit to me, via email what they have chosen by **March 31st**; however your student needs to sign up for Live Stations by Wednesday March 1st if they plan to participate in those. Your Student will be expected to complete his or her individual formation between March 1st - August 1st. Beginning on August 13th, your student will be required to attend biweekly meetings on Sunday Afternoons for in person group formation. We will have a speaker series while learning the values of the Catholic Faith, diving into the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and how to continue using those after Confirmation.

CHOOSING A SPONSOR

Candidates will be required to select a sponsor for Confirmation. This person should be someone the student looks up to as a model of the faith. The prayers of the Sponsor during preparation for Confirmation is so valuable and impactful. The relationship between the child and Sponsor does not end at Confirmation; but should be the continuation of a relationship that provides guidance in the faith.

Included among the sponsor requirements, sponsors:

- Must be at least 16 years old
- Must be a Catholic who has received both First Communion and Confirmation
- Must be an active, practicing Catholic
- Cannot be the Child's parent
- + If your sponsor is unable to attend the actual Sacrament of Confirmation, another adult (including a parent), may stand in his/her place as a proxy. The name of your chosen sponsor will still be noted in the official Church record of your Confirmation

SUGGESTED WAYS TO SUPPORT A CANDIDATE

Help the Candidate become aware of his or her reasons for receiving the sacrament of Confirmation.

Help the Candidate understand and appreciate the sacrament of Confirmation and have the right intention for receiving it.

Help the Candidate prepare for Confirmation by encouraging him or her to pray, to participate in the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation, and to become actively involved in the life of their parish.

Support the Candidate and their family and be a good example of Catholic Christian living.

Meet with the Candidate on a regular basis for Mass, prayer, faith-sharing, reading Scripture, and discussions about the Christian life.

Help the Candidate understand what it means to be a true disciple of Jesus Christ.

Present the Candidate to the bishop for Confirmation.

Ensure that the confirmed person behaves as a true witness of Christ and faithfully fulfills the obligations inherent in this sacrament.
